The awards were presented at MSU's annual Student Success Summit, which is an opportunity for faculty, advisors, and staff to connect at the end of the academic year on topics that support their student success work with an eye toward the future.

The Summit explored how faculty and staff continue to reform MSU using the Five Opportunity Areas of Student Success and celebrated impactful contributions across campus, including honoring those who received awards as part of the Five Opportunity Areas of Student Success Recognition Program.
